Quitman High School's Partnership with Arkansas State University-Beebe for Online Concurrent Enrollment

Quitman High School is proud to announce a new partnership with Arkansas State University-Beebe (ASU-Beebe) to offer online Concurrent Enrollment courses to qualified Juniors and Seniors. This program allows students to earn both high school and college credit simultaneously, providing a head start on their college education.

Course Offerings and Enrollment

Students can register through the Quitman High School counselor's office to participate in this program. Specific courses will be available, and minimum ACT or Accuplacer scores must be met for eligibility.

Financial Considerations

To ensure accessibility, Quitman High School will generously cover the tuition costs for these online Concurrent Enrollment courses. Students will be responsible for acquiring any necessary textbooks for their chosen classes.

State Minimum Core

State policy requires all state universities to accept ASU-Beebe's minimum core courses in transfer.
